

Exhibiting the unseen

A GROUP of South Hams artists is getting together to hold a special exhibition in Dartmouth this month.

Unseen South Hams is an exhibition organised by Move Your Arts, a community project involving professional artists and art students who are working to draw attention to the strong artistic community in this area.

Those involved include John Gillo, James Stewart, Frances Glynn and Kate Marshall. The exhibition will also feature the work of students originally from the Dartmouth area and A-level students from Dartmouth Community College.

It aims to shine a light on the South Hams, its beauty and its problems, so some of the work on show will explore themes of what are traditionally thought to be urban problems, such as unemployment, teenage pregnancy and drug abuse.

Unseen organiser Kate Marshall said: 'In addressing these issues we may find places considered ugly or uninspiring newly interesting or even beautiful.'

The exhibition will be held at the Old Library in Newcomen Road in Dartmouth from next Friday to next Sunday. It will be open from 6pm on Friday and from 10am to 4pm on Saturday and Sunday.
